Now that autumn is here if you are like me then you think of this time as start of a new season. We can expect the lower water temperatures to increase dissolved oxygen levels and bring more activity from the fish

For the fishing prospects I move away from “standard” size flies i.e. sizes 10, 12, 14 and move to the extremes. I have caught fry feeding trout that were chasing and eating 3-4 inch rudd while last week I spooned a trout from Bewl to find it full of buzzers that would need a size 20 hook to copy them.
