CHAIRMAN'S CHAT LINES

As we gear up for the new season's fishing, don't forget to check all lines, leader loops and rod rings. Before the tying season ends I will be running sessions on Thursday evenings on how to replace rod rings and how to fix braided loops - see the programme for details.

Sometimes we are so concerned about casting long distances that we are guilty of forgetting the obvious: fish often stay close to the bank and only move away because of the disturbance caused by anglers. When you approach a new swim, do so carefully and make your first casts when standing ten yards back from the bank using as much cover as possible.

Next, try casting parallel to the bank both to the left and right. Don't be tempted to double haul to the horizon until you are absolutely certain there are no fish closer in. There are at least two of our members who regularly fish in this way and usually manage to catch the first fish of the day on guild outings. Give it a try - it works!

Also make a note in your diary for our end of season dinner on 17th April. This is an opportunity to say thank you to wives and friends who have tolerated your tying and fishing activities over the last twelve months.

Finally, at the end of session social on the 22nd April, I will provide food and soft drinks only. If you would like to bring wine or beer etc. there is no problem but please remember to bring your own glasses.

SUSSEX PISCATORIAL

Sussex Piscatorial Society is one of the oldest angling clubs in the country (founded in 1891), and have a number of coarse and trout fisheries in Sussex where traditional angling methods are encouraged.

The trout section has three lakes, one near Heathfield and two just west of Steyning. They also have a stretch of the river Itchen in Hampshire.

Membership is £225.00 per annum (plus £50 initial one-off joining fee) which includes guest tickets making it exceedingly good value.

LIABILITY INSURANCE

As a member of the Flydressers' Guild you are covered for personal third party liability for up to £10 million through your subscription. The Branch also has similar cover for up to £5 million for events organized by the Branch (including the normal tying nights and demonstrations for instance).

Our insurers require us to advise them immediately following incidents in which they may have an interest, particularly incidents involving personal injury, and therefore any member who is involved in an incident whilst taking part in any Branch activity must immediately report the circumstances to the Secretary.

WEIL'S DISEASE

Whilst we are in a serious mood, and the fishing season is getting well under way, it might be wise to remind ourselves of the above. Weil's Disease (Leptospirosis) is a bacterial infection carried in rats' urine, which contaminates water and the banks of lakes, rivers and ponds.

The early symptoms are similar to those of 'flu and normally start 3 to 19 days after exposure to contaminated water. Every year people die from this disease, which is unnecessary because it is easily treated if diagnosed in time.

DON'T LET IT HAPPEN TO YOU!

There are a number of sensible precautions you can take:

- Cover any cuts, sores or scratches with waterproof plasters or gloves
- Disinfect any wounds that occur at the waterside
- Do not put your hand in your mouth after immersing in river water and never place bait or fishing line in your mouth
- Do not touch dead animals, especially rats
- If you develop 'flu-like symptoms that persist, tell your doctor that you may have been exposed to leptospirosis so the he/she can consider it in the diagnosis
- Do not leave food, ground bait or bait on the bankside.

After all that – enjoy yourself, keep safe and tight lines!!!

This sturgeon is still alive, worn out from the fight. They turned him loose after the photo, having weighed in at over 1,000 lbs and measured 11'1". It was 56" around the girth, and took over 6½ hours, and 4 dozen beers, for the four guys taking turns reeling it in....

Any sturgeon OVER five feet has to be released unharmed and cannot be removed from the water. They are brood/breeding stock and probably older than most of us.
