Our guest speaker for October was our favourite Swede, over here for the BFFI. This was a very welcome return visit and we were not disappointed. He gave us a fine overview of fishing round the year, largely in his home territory of Southern Sweden, but with tantalising glimpses of fine fishing round the world, including the North of England.

He then proceeded to demonstrate the tying of some of his fly patterns – simple but so effective. The flies he tied are in our archive, so do ask to see them if you want to try to tie some.

Earlier in the day, the writer had the pleasure of fishing with Johan at Ashbourne, a venue he wanted to re-visit. I can verify his fishing skills are of the same calibre as his tying and presentations, with a count well into double figures, having been given special permission to practice catch and release by Doug Chalmers. He started with an experimental fly, the "Hint of Pink" using a Marc Petitjean development – virtually a take every cast! Then a fish took the fly but after a strong fight broke the leader and escaped. Being his last fly of that pattern (I had already lost the other in a similar way!) he put on a damsel and was soon into a fish. Imagine his surprise when unhooking in the net he found the lost fly also in its mouth – so much for spooking trout!!

Johan spends half his time teaching and the other half fly-fishing – his DVDs are a delight to watch too – and is a fine photographer, as can be seen below – what a wealth of talent!

Waterproof coats

About eighteen months ago I wrote a short article expressing my soggy disappointment with various waterproofing systems used in clothes.

I had turned to a mountaineering jacket using a completely different method of producing a breathable and waterproof coat. I have now tested this coat in extreme wet exposure (a full day's wind and rain in a boat on Bewl) and am glad to say the coat performed perfectly. The coat is made by the **Nikwax** company and is called a **Paramo**. Most of the coats are for mountain use so are in bright colours but there is one available in "Forest Green". Mine cost around £200.
