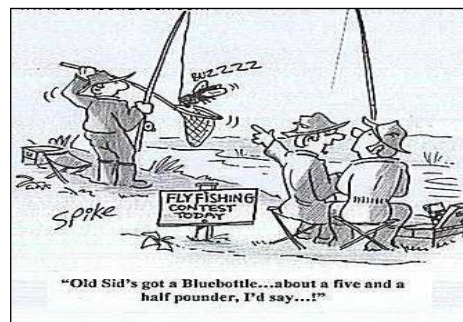

Chairman's Chat

I am afraid this is a moan. Why do we take so much advice from "expert" anglers who write in the various fishing magazines?

I recently read an article in a fly fishing magazine regarding using small flies for wary fish. The writer visited a large lake in order to try and make contact with some large brown trout that had been in the lake a long time and become very wary. Some of these fish were known to be in the 9 – 10 lb range, truly magnificent specimens.

He recommended a leader. 9.0 ft tapered leader to aid turnover to a 3.0 pound breaking strain tippet. To ensure that thick anglers understood, the author provided a photograph of himself holding a tapered leader in a packet of tippet material.

That's a relief, even I could understand that.

Great, with an optimistic efficiency of 75% this tippet will fail at 2.25 lbs. due to knot loss. Just the ideal set up for a 9.0 lb brown trout.

It worked, no less than two large brown trout in the "9 lb class" took his flies but alas, they broke his tippet, I wonder why that was? What was the problem? The owner of the lake was very impressed that the set up managed to hook into two large fish.

I was not impressed. Now we have a lake with two large brown trout with hooks set in their jaws and trailing lengths of leader, for the rest of their lives. This is such an obvious outcome that I was tempted to write to the magazine and point this out. How did the article get past the Editor? Anyway I am sure that my letter would not have been published on the basis that it is criticism.
