We then sell these flies at a significantly reduced price and add the money to the collection box. All the proceeds are eventually **donated to the RNLI**. In our most recent collection, we were able to raise£92.74. Along with another contribution, Moorhen Trout Fishery donated a total of £243.00 to charity, thanks to your help.
